SECTION 2 - HAZARDS IDENTIFICATION

Emergency Overview

Aggravated Medical Conditions

Pre-existing eye, skin, liver, kidney, and respiratory disorders may be aggravated by exposure.

Chronic Health Effects

Prolonged or repeated skin contact with asphalt may result in skin sensitivity, such as irritation, rashes, and dermatitis. Prolonged or repeated exposure to polycyclic aromatic hydrocarbons and other volatiles which are contained in trace amounts in asphalt have been shown to cause cancer or respiratory damage in animals. Prolonged or repeated exposure to butyl benzyl phthalate may cause reduced body weights and adverse effects on the liver, kidney, spleen, pancreas, and reproductive organs. Overexposure to maleic anhydride can cause allergic asthmatic responses and, after long-term exposure, bronchitis. Diphenylmethane diisocyanate (methylene bisphenyl isocyanate) caused an increased incidence of lung tumors in experimental animals following long term inhalation at concentrations in excess of 100 times the exposure limit. Fillers are encapsulated and not expected to be released from product under normal conditions of use.
